

A Rainbow Promise Story



After more than a year in the ark, it must have been wonderful to leave it. Noah's family stepped out into the clean, sweet air. They stood and smiled in

the warm, welcoming sunshine. It was probably a bit scary, too. The world looked so different, and it was so quiet. The eight people who walked off the ark were the only people left on the entire earth. They were starting over, alone and together. Soon, the animals were freed. Noah's family must have seen their joy and excitement. They must have laughed as the animals pranced and danced.

Would they, too, be wiped off the earth? No. They didn't need to worry. God had given them His promise.

They had worked hard to care for all those animals. And now they were to resettle the earth and start over. God had given them something very precious. He gave them the experience of the rainbow to share. It would be a blessing and a promise to treasure forever—for them and for us. We

How many people survived the flood?


What was the promise God gave Noah and his sons?

Rainbow Art Craft

Are you ready for another awesome craft idea to assist you in remembering today's lesson? Well let's begin making our very own Rainbow art Craft!

Step 1

The first thing you will want to do is print out the cloud printable onto <u>white cardstock</u>, or you can draw your own cloud pattern. Then <u>cut</u> them out and write or color the words "God is FAITHFUL He Keeps His Promises!" onto the cloud pattern. Use your rainbow-colored crayons to color the words.

Step 2

Make sure you have <u>red</u>, <u>orange</u>, <u>yellow</u>, <u>green</u>, <u>blue</u> and <u>purple</u> strip of construction paper to show all the colors of the rainbow. Next, cut out construction paper into 1 1/4" strips.

Step 3

After that, take your strips of <u>red</u>, <u>orange</u>, <u>yellow</u>, <u>green</u>, <u>blue</u>, and <u>purple</u> construction paper and <u>glue</u> it to the back of the cloud.


Step 4

In order to allow the craft to hang, add a piece of <u>pipe cleaner, yarn</u>, or ribbon, and attach it to the top of the cloud on the back with a piece of tape or glue.

Step 5

Once the craft is dry, you can hang it up and always have a reminder that **God is FAITHFUL and Always Keeps** his Promises!
